End of term. There will be two ceremonies. F-6 at 8.20 and 7-9 at 9.30.

Lucia ceremony. Will also be split up into two ceremonies (too many pupils to have one at the moment). Half school will have theirs on the 13th of December, the rest on the 14th of December. Grades will be mixed on each ceremony, lower and higher, so more info will come on the dates for each class.

PLEASE NOTE! It's in not allowed to take pictures or film at these ceremonies (or at school at all) and absolutely not allowed to publish anything on social media, out of integrity and safety reasons. **Please respect!**

International Day was held with great success. The celebration has been renamed from UN-day to International Day, as some pupils come from countries that are not members of the UN. Earlier it wasn't possible for all children to carry their flag in the context of celebrating the UN, but this way children with all nationalities can participate.

Spring term 2017. Term starts Wednesday 11 January. 9 and 10 are study/planning days.

Open house is Saturday 28th of January. Monday 30 of January will be off.

Development talks. Many teachers have experienced problems with parents not showing up to the talks, or cancelling late. As the talks take quite a lot of time to prepare for the teachers, from now on teachers will have the talk with the pupil, if the parent/parents don't show up. Cancelling and rescheduling will be allowed once only. If you need to reschedule; please notify the teacher as soon as possible.

This is out of respect for the teachers' work environment and that's also the reason all meetings can't be held late afternoons.
